Course Description: Basic language use in everyday life, basic listening, speaking, pronunciation skills, grammatical forms of primary importance, reading short sentences and writing words.

Course Objectives: The course aims to enable students to:

1. conduct basic oral communication with correct pronunciation.
2. comprehend simple spoken Thai essential in everyday communication.
3. read and write Thai words.
4. understand the basic culture of the Thai language use.
5. apply the knowledge of Thai language and culture in real life.

The Plan-Do-Check-Act Cycle (PDCA) provides an easy but effective approach for problem solving and managing change, ensuring that ideas are appropriately tested before the full implementation. It can be used in all sorts of situations and can be clarified as follows:

Plan: Define the current problem, process, and issue and establish objectives and processes required to deliver the desired results.

Do: Implement the plans and new processes developed.

Check: Monitor and evaluate the implemented process by testing the results against the predetermined objectives.

Act: Apply actions necessary for improvement if the results require changes.

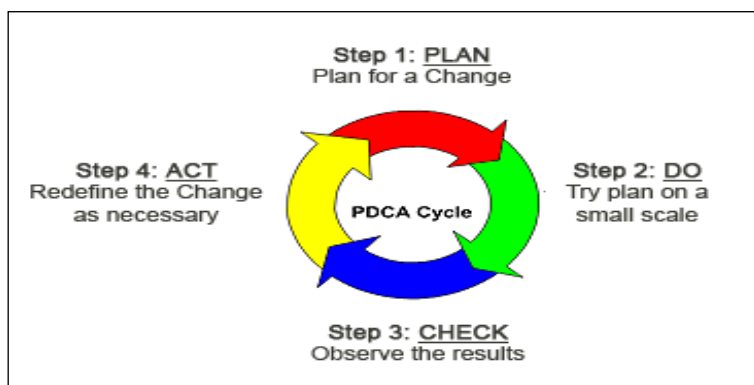


Figure 1: PDCA Cycle (<http://www.swopehealth.org>)
