Course Description:

The development of communication and English language skills needed to perform in a variety of human resources (HR) situations including the enhancement of HR terminologies and phrases used in the international HR context.

Objectives:

1. define HR terms and jargons from the reading materials.
2. apply HR terms and jargons in discussions and written assignments.
3. summarize and discuss HR related topics they have read and listened to.
4. identify the basic elements of various types of typical HR texts and correspondence; write related texts in HR context.

Quality Assurance Process

The Plan-Do-Check-Act Cycle (PDCA) provides an easy but effective approach for problem solving and managing change, ensuring that ideas are appropriately tested before the full implementation. It can be used in all sorts of situations and can be clarified as follows:

Plan: Define the current problem, process, and issue and establish objectives and processes required to deliver the desired results.

Do: Implement the plans and new processes developed.

Check: Monitor and evaluate the implemented process by testing the results against the predetermined objectives.

Act: Apply actions necessary for improvement if the results require changes.

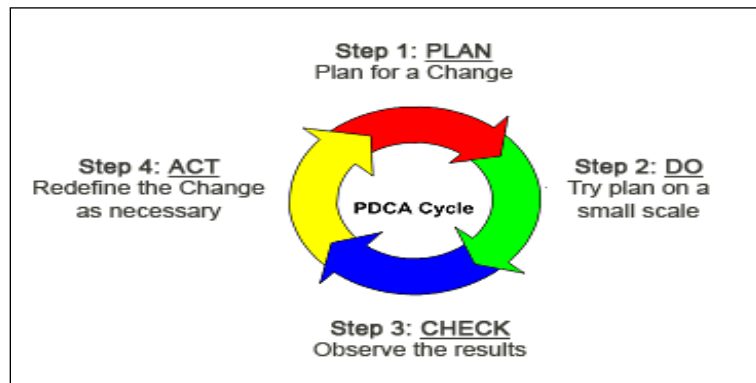


Figure 1: PDCA Cycle (<http://www.swopehealth.org>)
