Course Description : Basic conversations and texts concerning everyday life to broaden basic vocabulary and Chinese grammar.

Course Objectives : This course aims to enable students to:
 1. acquire basic grammar and approximately 600 Chinese vocabularies.
 2. read and write Chinese conversations and texts on daily life.
 3. use basic vocabularies and grammar to make conversation.

Course Learning Outcomes: After completing this course, students will be able to:
 1. use Chinese vocabularies and grammar correctly.
 2. develop reading and writing skills through conversations and short passages.
 3. communicate more fluently in Chinese through daily life conversations.

Teaching-Learning Activities:

 2. Assignment (Handwriting 3%, Exercises 3%, Class activities 3% and Attendance 1%)
 3. Class Participation (Dictations 6%, Reading tests 2 times 4%)

Plan: Define the current problem, process, and issue and establish objectives and processes required to deliver the desired results.

Do: Implement the plans and new processes developed.

Check: Monitor and evaluate the implemented process by testing the results against the predetermined objectives.

Act: Apply actions necessary for improvement if the results require changes.

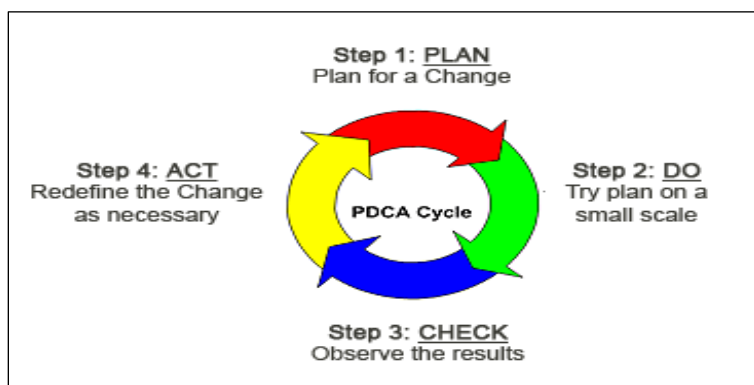


Figure 1: PDCA Cycle (<http://www.swopehealth.org>)
