**Act**: Apply actions necessary for improvement if the results require changes.

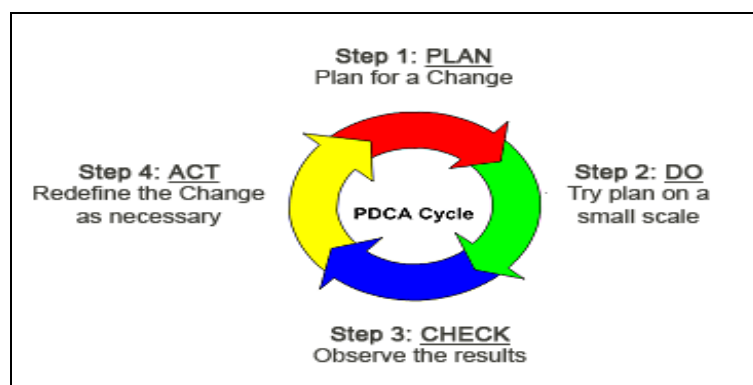


Figure 1 :PDCA Cycle ) <http://www.swopehealth.org> (
